

What is an audiogram?

An audiogram is a test that measures how well you can hear different sounds. It is done by a hearing professional. The test shows the range of frequencies you can hear and how loud the sounds are. The results are shown on a graph. The graph has frequency on the x-axis (ranging from 125 Hz to 8000 Hz) and intensity on the y-axis (ranging from 0 dB to 120 dB). The results are plotted as lines for each ear. The lines show the range of frequencies you can hear and how loud the sounds are. The results are used to determine if you have hearing loss and what type of hearing loss you have.

Why should I get audiograms?

To determine if you have hearing loss.
To determine the type of hearing loss you have.
To determine the degree of hearing loss you have.
To determine if your hearing loss is progressive.

Do I have normal hearing?

Can you hear the following sounds?
A tuning fork held behind your ear.
A watch ticking in your ear.
